





MERAMEC CAVERNS

The story of **Meramec Caverns** in **Stanton** is rife with history. The formation occurred patiently over millions of years of limestone erosion.

First used as shelter for American Indians, it eventually became a saltpeter mine (to make gunpowder) for the Union army. But, the cave system's most illustrious inhabitant might just be the outlaw Jesse James, who is reported to have used the 4.6 miles of passages as a hideout. Along with guided tours of the breathtaking natural wonder, the caverns also offer a zip-lining adventure, canoe rentals and even the opportunity to pan for gold.

Tom Sawyer Days (July 4-7, 2012)

Even if you haven't read the book, you've heard of him and his famous fictional escapades. Take a journey to a simpler, albeit just as exciting, place and time for **Tom Sawyer Days** in **Hannibal**. Now in its 57th year, Mark

Twain's hometown hosts this incredible annual festival that includes everything from great food and live entertainment to frog-jumping contests and sack races. And, of course, don't miss the main event, The National Fence Painting Contest. Cheer on whitewashers as they attempt to cover a portion of fence in record time. (Note: It's even more fun - and hilarious - to watch when one of the men in your life is competing.)

66 DRIVE-IN THEATRE

Few leisurely activities carry with them the nostalgia and sentiment of the American drive-in. At **66 Drive-In The-atre** in **Carthage**, you will certainly find out why. Fall back in love with the outdoor cinema experience by catching a double feature from your car or lawn chair. Enjoy the classic intermission trailer between films, or head to the concession stand for some traditional refreshments. Add in the fact that it is located off historic Route **66**, and you have Americana at its finest.

PATEE HOUSE MUSEUM

Walking through the **Patee House Museum** in **St. Joseph** is like walking through a real-life history book. Built in 1858 as a luxury hotel, the structure was The Pony Express Headquarters from 1860 to 1861. Today, it is home to two full floors of exhibits, such as a 19th century train, stagecoach, real gallows and even a reproduction of the streets of old-time St. Jo. There are also shops, toys, models, and a vintage carousel inside that visitors are encouraged to ride.

WARM SPRINGS RANCH

The iconic Budweiser Clydesdales have been a charming part of our culture since 1933, when they were introduced to celebrate the repeal of prohibition. Today, they travel to hundreds of live appearances each year to bring a smile to every face in the crowd. But, did you know you could also visit them? Warm Springs Ranch near Boonville is home to more than 100 of the majestic creatures, and offers tours (reservations required). Stop

by for a tour of this facility, which covers 300 acres, features a 25,000-square-foot breeding facility, is home to a 1903 Studebaker-built beer wagon, and luxury transport tractor-trailers. And, of course, enjoy the opportunity for an up-close-and-personal visit with the Clydesdales themselves.





Or that each of its 10 guest rooms has its own unique style and is outfitted with antiques. Or, that the award-winning B&B is located very close to The Katy Trail and Les Bourgeois Winery. Come to think of it, the name only tells you it was a school.

Southern Hotel

When it comes to the measure of a bed and breakfast's appeal, many times it's the little things that have a huge impact. And **Southern Hotel** in **Ste. Genevieve** is a shining example of this truth. From the antique

claw-foot bathtubs to the gourmet French breakfasts served each morning, the circa-1790 three-story

The 200-acres of lush countryside offer some of the most beautiful and relaxing views in the state. The resort boasts two separate historic inns that evoke country warmth, present luxurious amenities, and provide serene landscapes. In short, if you need to relax, this is your place.

Benner House

The beautiful **Benner House Bed & Breakfast** in **Weston**, graced with two stories of wrap-around porches, a serene perennial and water garden, and a terraced back yard with an in-ground pool, is the embodiment of elegance. The Queen Anne-style home was built in 1898 and










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
